

and play as if tuned in the regular manner.

Some pieces are played in the above tunening, commonly called "Fandango" tunening, which consists of tuneing the high E to the open D string, and the E Bass to the open D string one octave apart, the A Bass to the open G string, one octave lower, the other three strings remain in the regular tunening. In most cases these
pieces are played the same as if tuned in the regular manner, however some pieces are written with the same
notes used in the tunening, and must be played according to the tones the notes represent. (See examples of
the two different styles below)
